

The Antichrist's Deadly Wound and other Mysteries

On this program I want to talk about the Antichrist and the deadly wound that he receives, as described by Saint John, in the book of Revelation.

Let's look at chapter 13 verse number 1. 'And I saw a beast rise up out of the sea having seven heads and ten horns, and upon his horns ten crowns, and upon his heads names of blasphemy.' Now all Bible scholars will tell you that this beast which rises up out of the sea is the Antichrist, and Saint John continues in verse number 3, 'and I saw one of his heads as it were wounded to death, and his deadly wound was healed and the whole earth wondered after the beast'.

Now here is where the Bible scholars get it wrong. Most of them assume that it is the Antichrist who receives this deadly wound, but remember the Antichrist has seven heads, consequently it cannot be the Antichrist who receives the deadly wound, because if he has seven heads, this must be symbolism, which Saint John is talking about. We need to find out what the seven heads represent.

Now most Bibles scholars understand that the ten crowns represent world leaders, and since 10 is a number of completion in the Bible, this means that all of the world leaders will support the Antichrist. But the seven heads, Bible scholars have a much more difficult time with. Notice Saint John says they have on their heads, names of blasphemy. What Saint John is talking about here, is the seven most important religious leaders of the world, and since 7 is also a number of completion, this means that all of the world's religious leaders will also support the Antichrist.

Now this idea that the seven world's most important religious leaders will support the Antichrist can be verified in the Old Testament, in the book of Isaiah. In chapter 4, verse 1, Isaiah writes, 'and in that day seven women shall take hold of one man saying, we will eat our own bread and wear are own apparel, only let us be called by your name, and take away our reproach.

Now just last week a YouTuber sent me a message saying he believed the seven women represent the last seven apostate churches, and I believe he is right. These are the same as the seven heads with blasphemous names that Saint John is talking about in Revelation.

Now the 'one man', who they take a hold of, is the Antichrist, again, the same as in Revelation. When they say they 'eat their own bread', that means they do not eat of the bread of life, that is Jesus Christ. When they say they wear their own apparel', that means they make up their own doctrines and dogmas which are not Christian in foundation.

Thus we see that both Isaiah and Saint John are talking about an end times situation, where all the world's religions will support and work with the Antichrist, including Christianity, and the apostate Catholic Church.

Looking back at chapter 13 verse 3, 'I saw one of the heads, that is the heads of the Antichrist, one of the seven leaders of the false religions, 'as it were wounded to death', and his deadly wound was healed. Now I'm going to suggest, that one of his heads, that is one of the world's religious leaders, is undoubtedly his number one religious leader, and that is the False Prophet.

Let's look at verse number 11, 'and I saw another beast coming up out of the earth, and he had two horns like a lamb, and he spoke like a dragon'. Now most Bible scholars recognize that this beast is the False Prophet. And Saint John continues, 'and he exercised all the power of the first beast in his sight and he caused the earth and all that dwell therein to worship the first beast whose deadly wound was healed'.

Now I admit this sounds as if it might be the Antichrist whose wound is healed, but remember it is one of his seven heads, whose wound is healed. We need to recognize that this deadly wound to one of the Antichrist's seven heads, is a phoney wound, 'and I saw one of his heads as it were wounded to death'. In other words, this is a big scheme between the Antichrist and the False Prophet. And Saint John writes 'the whole earth wondered after the beast', in other words, the False Prophet is wounded to death, as it were the Antichrist heals him, and is therefore declared divine by the False Prophet.

So I hope this program cleared up some misconceptions about the Antichrist, and the deadly wound he receives. It is actually the False Prophet who receives the phoney deadly wound, and the False Prophet is one of the seven heads of the Antichrist and the seven heads of the Antichrist are the same as the seven women in Isaiah. Both sevens represent the apostate churches of the end times
