

## How did Micah seal up his Donald Trump Prophecy?

On this program I want to talk about how the great Old Testament prophet, Micah, sealed up his End Times prophecies about Donald J. Trump in his chapter number 5. And he sealed up the prophecies in very much the same way that Zachariah and Ezekiel and Daniel and others sealed up their End Times prophecies and they did it by rearranging their verses or their chapters to give very significant apocalyptic prophecy. For example, Daniel wrote 12 chapters (by the way, in the Douay-Rheims you have to ignore chapters 13 and 14; they should be separate). We need to count just the twelve chapters which are divided into six 'history' chapters, that is 1 through 6, and then 7 through 12, which are the 'vision' chapters. Now, you may note that 6 plus 6 is an evil number; it's the number of the Antichrist.

Well, it turns out that chapters 10 and 12 of Daniel are actually the same chapter and therefore there are actually 6 history chapters followed by 5 vision chapters and that simply means that the Antichrist, whose number is 6, will be defeated by Mary's Rosary, which number is 5. And because End Times prophecy is a gift from the Holy Spirit, you need two people to understand the prophecy, both the prophet, who usually gave the prophecy thousands of years ago, and a co-prophet in these End Times and in this case, yours truly. And I'm not saying I'm the only co-prophet; there could be others as well.

So now, how did Micah set up his End Times prophecy about Donald J. Trump? How did he seal it up so that we only understand it at this time? First, you take the 14 verses and you arrange them as shown on this chart with 4 verses on the left, 5 in the middle and 5 on the right.

By the way, in this case, you have to ignore the King James Version because they divided verse 11 into two verses. And yes, that would give you a Rosary number, 5 plus 5 plus 5, but you wouldn't receive a message and the message must always be that the Antichrist is defeated by Mary's Rosary. But how do we know this is how Micah determined to have his verses arranged? Well, the last five verses, that is 10 through 14, are the only one spoken by God himself. That's how Micah set those verses apart: by their topic. The middle 5 verses are separated by topic also, since they are about the Assyrian

and the remnant of Jacob. And the first four verses are primarily about Donald Trump and the remnant Catholic Church.

But 4 verses followed by two 5 verses does not give you a prophecy either. There are no 666 verses to indicate the Antichrist in between the 4 and the 5. However, if we break down these verses further, the way Micah wanted us to, then we will be given an End Times prophecy. In other words, in the last five verses, 10 through 14, which are spoken by God, the first three verses God says 'I will destroy' and in the last two verses he says 'I will' and then he does something else.

So, Micah himself has divided this passage into a 3 verse section, 10, 11 and 12, followed by a two verse section, 13 and 14, and 3 before 2 is a fraction and the fraction yields the decimal 1.5 and since the decimal points don't count as far as prophecy goes,

15 is an expression of Mary's Rosary, 5 plus 5 plus 5.

And sure enough, if you look at the previous five verses, that is 5 through 9, they are divided into a 2 + 3 verse section; the first two verses, that is 5 and 6, are about the Assyrian and the next three verses, 7, 8 and 9, are about the remnant of Jacob. And what does

that give you? That gives you the fraction 2 before 3, or 2/3rds and that equals the decimal .666, as I have mentioned many times on this program, and that is, of course, the number of the Antichrist. So now, we have an expression of 666 followed by an expression of 555 and this corresponds with all End Times prophecies from the Old Testament. It's truly amazing!

So, what about the number 4, the first four verses? When you divide those into numbers 1 and 2 on the left column and 3 and 4 on the center column, that's because this 4 is not 4 plus 4 plus 4, which signifies Obama and the United States, but in this case 2 plus 2

signifies mankind, in other words, two couples, a man and a woman plus a man and a woman. And now, if you put all three sections together, here is what Micah's final End Times chart looks like for his chapter number 5.

Of course, the proof of the pudding is: if you read these verses horizontally, which is the way they should be read, do they enhance the prophecy? Do they help us to understand? And we're going to find out that, yes indeed, they do.

The verses themselves give a prophecy: mankind's era will be followed by the reign of the Antichrist who in turn will be defeated by Mary's Rosary. However, there is one more change we have to make. Please note that the first three verses are in a 1-3-5 sequence. Those are Rosary numbers also and to make the prophecy even a little more accurate, you reverse 3 and 5 and here is the chart in its final manifestation:

1-5-3 are the first three verses. And we've already looked at those three verses on this program; on the next program I want to look at verses 7, 10 and 13 because they get into the second major prophecy in Micah's chapter number five, and that is the End Times fate of the Jews and the nation of Israel.
