

Bible Clues Reveal Identifies of Enoch and Elijah

On this program I want to talk about the two witnesses, Enoch and Elijah, who God will send back to earth, following the destruction of America, Britain, and Russia in World War 3, and, the takeover of the Roman Catholic Church, by the New World Order. Let's see where Saint John describes, these Two Prophets, in the Book of Revelation.

In chapter 11, Saint John writes, "And I will give power to my Two Witnesses, and they shall prophesy 1,260 days". And in verse number 7, "And when they have finished their testimony, the beast that ascends out of the bottomless pit, shall make war against them, and overcome them, and kill them." Notice that it is the beast from the bottomless pit, that is, the One World Government, that will kill the Two Prophets, not the Antichrist, as is so commonly misunderstood.

Now, let's look at an earlier passage in Revelation that describes Elijah's role in the End Times. In chapter 7, Saint John writes, "And I saw another angel, coming up from the rising of the sun, having the seal of the living God". Now, how do we know that Saint John is describing Elijah here? As you know, in Bible prophecy, Jerusalem is the center of the universe. So, the "rising of the sun", would refer to an area East of Jerusalem.

Now, Elijah was called the Tishbite, because he was from Thesbes, a town in the Gilead mountains which is East of Jerusalem. Therefore, Saint John is using this "sun" imagery to describe the prophet, Elijah. Elijah's primary mission will be to convert the Jews. And now, let's look at where Saint John describes the prophet, Enoch. In chapter 10, Saint John writes, "and I saw another mighty angel come down from heaven, clothed with a cloud, and a rainbow was on his head, and his face was as the sun, and his feet as pillars of fire."

Now, once again, Saint John is using "sun" imagery, to describe the prophet, Enoch. From Bible history, we know that Enoch was "translated" into heaven, when he was 365 years of age. When this prophet's "face is as the sun", Saint John is referring to a solar year, which, as you know, has 365 days. So, that is the connection. Enoch lived 365 years, and a solar calendar consists of 365 days. Once again, Saint John uses "sun" imagery to reveal who this prophet is. And in verse 2, we find what Enoch's mission is, "And he had in his hand a little open book, and he set his right foot on the sea, and his left foot on the land". The reason Enoch has one foot on the sea, and one foot on the land, is because his mission is to the Gentiles. That means

he will preach to island nations and landlocked nations, in other words, to the entire rest of the world. And Saint John continues in verse number 5, "And the angel which I saw standing on the sea, and upon the earth, lifted up his hand to heaven, and he swore by Him who, lives for ever and ever, that time shall be no longer". Now, here we find Enoch's second mission, and that is to give the timing of the end.

And now let's look at where the Two Witnesses, Enoch and Elijah, are found in the Book of Daniel. In chapter 12, Daniel writes "Then I, Daniel, looked and behold, two others stood, one on this side of the bank of the river, and the other, on that side of the bank of the river". Now, the one on this side of the bank of the river, would be the prophet, Elijah, because he is preaching in Jerusalem, in other words, on the near bank. The prophet on the far bank of the river would be the prophet, Enoch, because he is preaching to the far off Gentile nations. And now, Daniel asks a question of Enoch "And I said to the man clothed in linen, who was upon the waters of the river, how long shall it be to the end of these wonders?"

Notice here, the prophet is now standing on the waters, whereas in the previous verse, he was standing on the bank. In other words, just as in Revelation, the prophet, Enoch, has one foot on the land and one foot on the sea, again, indicating that his mission is to many peoples and many nations. And notice that it is Enoch, who Daniel asks the question about the timing of the end. Remember, back in Revelation, the mighty angel was clothed with a cloud, with a rainbow on his head, and his face like the sun. Notice the time sequence there first the rain cloud, then the rainbow, and then the sun.

And we continue with Daniel and "He held up his right hand and his left hand to heaven, and swore by him that lives forever ..." Now, here the prophet holds up both hands, whereas back in Revelation, he held up only one hand, because in Revelation, he was holding a little book in the other hand. And when he swears by Him who lives forever, this is almost the exact same phraseology as in Revelation. And Enoch says that "it will be a time, times and half a time, and when the scattering of the holy people shall be accomplished, all these things shall be finished". Now, the "time, times and half a time" refers to the Antichrist, which is the second half of the Tribulation period. Again, one of Enoch's missions will be to preach about the timing of the end. In conclusion, by studying the clues that Saint John leaves us, we can determine that the Two Witnesses are the prophets Enoch and Elijah, not Elijah and Moses, as some claim.
