

Mary's School of Prophecy Querida Amazonia - Pt 1

We're going to talk about Querida Amazonia. It means beloved Amazon, and I got to read about half of it today, so what I'm going to do is to go through a few of the quotes from it. I'll put it on the screen to give you an idea of the flavour of it. To me it's a great big nothing burger. Really, I mean it's just mostly liberal platitudes.

Of course Pope Francis comes from that area. He ought to know about it. Maybe this is his solution. His solution is no solution, but if you read through it, it's not too bad. The one part that I was looking for is what Life Site News said this morning. They did a review of it, very early. I turned on my internet about 7:30 and for an hour they had already had a program up on it. And I'll quote what he said. That part of this Querida Amazonia apostolic exhortation is, "There is no room for a discipline that excludes and turns people away", which sounds like it came right out of *Amoris Laetitia*. In other words there is no reason to deny Communion to anyone, and I suspected that is probably the goal of this particular apostolic exhortation.

It does not seem to be that a married priest is the goal, but on the other hand there is a part of it that says, that he is not adding anything to the statement that came out of the Amazon Synod by the bishops. Well if that's true, that statement does include married priests, so I am sure what will happen is that bishops in Germany for example, they're just going right in and start ordaining married priests, then this pope is not going to say anything about it. That's exactly what he wants. He doesn't want to shoulder the responsibility. He wants the bishops to provide him cover, and so you're going to find that a lot of liberal bishops, not just in Germany but elsewhere are going to start ordaining married deacons, you watch. That is my prediction, although my prediction of this did not really come true. I was going to make a bet with my priest Father Ward, but it's a good thing I didn't. He would have won the bet.

So before we start, let's say the prayer to Our Lady of All Nations. In the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, Amen. Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Father, send now Your Spirit over the earth. Let the Holy Spirit live in the hearts of all nations, that they may be preserved from degeneration, disaster and war. May the Lady of All Nations, the Blessed Virgin Mary, be our Advocate, Amen.

So now I'm going to read parts of this Querida Amazonia. It means beloved Amazon, and this would be paragraph 26. There are 111 paragraphs in all. I haven't looked at the numerology of this apostolic exhortation. It could be significant, because of course 111 is a significant End Times number. So let's look at paragraph 26. I'll put it on the screen for you.

26. The Amazon region ought to be a place of social dialogue, especially between the various original peoples, for the sake of developing forms of fellowship and joint struggle. The rest of us are called to participate as “guests” and to seek out with great respect paths of encounter that can enrich the Amazon region. If we wish to dialogue, we should do this in the first place with the poor. They are not just another party to be won over, or merely another individual seated at a table of equals.

So that's very positive. I mean you know it's probably naive but you really can't find any fault with it. I mean there's no doubt that when civilization starts intruding upon the territories of indigenous peoples everywhere, they face hostile indigenous people very often, if you're going to develop a region, and unlike Pope Francis not all development is evil.

And I'm going to show you an interesting picture. I went to Google images and I typed in “indigenous Amazon”. I'm not sure if this is what Pope Francis is talking about, “a meeting of cultures”, but this is kind of interesting. Here's an indigenous girl taking a selfie.



And I think we have to admit that if the indigenous peoples are introduced to civilization, they won't reject it. Why should they? I mean I don't think that primitive peoples really have a lot to offer even to their own people. Let me read the rest of paragraph 26.

They are our principal dialogue partners, those from whom we have the most to learn, to whom we need to listen out of a duty of justice, and from whom we must ask permission before presenting our proposals. Their words, their hopes and their fears should be the most authoritative voice at any table of dialogue on the Amazon region. And the great question is: “What is their idea of ‘good living’ for themselves and for those who will come after them?”

Well as they say, that all sounds like liberal propaganda, and it probably mostly is, and he never addresses in this apostolic exhortation the problems of a pagan peoples who want to kill us, and I'm going to show you a picture here of a missionary, who actually did a lot of good in the Amazon region. He set up a hostel

according to what I read about him. I never heard of him before, and he received awards from the local people, but that didn't stop some of them from killing him.

So here here's a picture of this missionary. He had been there a long time and he was burned to death. So Pope Francis has got to come to grips with the collision between the two. A pagan indigenous people and civilization are going to have rough edges, and you can't just say we've got to listen to them and accept their ideas. Some of their ideas we don't want to accept. I think the Pope has got to understand that. I'm sure he does understand it.

So now I want to look at the next quote from here, so you get an idea, just to give you a flavour, because I mean it goes on and on. This is paragraph 63.

63. An authentic option for the poor and the abandoned, while motivating us to liberate them from material poverty and to defend their rights, also involves inviting them to a friendship with the Lord that can elevate and dignify them. How sad it would be if they were to receive from us a body of teachings or a moral code, but not the great message of salvation, the missionary appeal that speaks to the heart and gives meaning to everything else in life.

As I say, you really can't disagree with that. I mean I think he's right .That's what the missionary does. Every missionary reaches out to teach people who have no idea who Jesus is. I mean that's our number one goal is to educate the world about who our Lord is.

And let me read the rest of that paragraph 63.

Nor can we be content with a social message. If we devote our lives to their service, to working for the justice and dignity that they deserve, we cannot conceal the fact that we do so because we see Christ in them and because we acknowledge the immense dignity that they have received from God, the Father who loves them with boundless love.

Again, I don't disagree with any of that, but there's going to be conflict as you can see. And of course when they start throwing poisonous darts at you, I'm sure you've seen pictures of them with people flying over trying to land and meet the indigenous people, and they're greeted with hostility. So one way or another they've got to be brought into the 21st century and there are going to be conflicts there, and the Pope seems to gloss over that. It's very possible that this is a nothing burger, and he could be using this as a way to give Communion to everyone, although I haven't found this yet in his apostolic excitement. It must be in here somewhere.

And here's what Life Site News says. This is supposedly a [quote](#). "No room for a discipline that excludes and turns people away." Well if he's talking about the Eucharist, he's not doing what Jesus said. Jesus said do not give that which is holy to the dogs. Now I'm not saying we have to say that all the indigenous people are dogs. I'm certainly not saying that, but let's face it, for probably hundreds of years the church has been in the Amazon area, and Pope seems to think that everything that's gone before him has been useless. He's got that impression that we've got to change. It's our fault if there's any problem in the Amazon. You get that feeling that that's what he is saying.

And now there's one more quote I want to take from his Querida Amazonia and this is about the duty of a priest. Paragraph 88:

88. The priest is a sign of that head and wellspring of grace above all when he celebrates the Eucharist, the source and summit of the entire Christian life. [128] That is his great power, a power that can only be received in the sacrament of Holy Orders. For this reason, only the priest can say: "This is my body". There are other words too, that he alone can speak: "I absolve you from your sins". Because sacramental forgiveness is at the service of a worthy celebration of the Eucharist. These two sacraments lie at the heart of the priest's exclusive identity.

Again, I couldn't agree more. Maybe the Pope is converting. Maybe he realizes that if he doesn't resign, he's going to go to Hell, because he's bringing in a lot of

confusion. In any event, I think the fruits of this apostolic exhortation will be seen in how the bishops interpret it, and as I say, if the German bishops ordain married men without even asking approval from the Vatican, this Pope is not going to stop them, and I think that is how we are going to see the fruits of this apostolic exhortation.

I will try to continue this tomorrow. I didn't have time to read the whole thing and I think it's worth reading even though, as I say, what I've seen so far is that it's a big nothing burger. I think it's got a lot of hype, but it doesn't live up to my view except that actually, what I read is pretty traditional, pretty solid.
