

Another Evil Image in the Catholic Church

Now this is a missal at that we use in our church, and other than the cover, it's really a very good booklet. It has many good hymns. The script is all very easy to read, but this year's missal, which we just got a few weeks ago, it's very evil. Now don't tell my priest, because I'm not going to tell him, or he would throw out all the thousands of dollars worth of booklets in our three parishes, and I hope he doesn't do that. I think we can avoid looking at this evil image, but I'm going to put it up close so you can see what it looks like. Now you, my subscribers are well aware of what a One World

Religion image looks like, and you can see, this is a chalice with a host

above it. However the chalice is in the form of two horns on either side, and of course that is a symbol of Hathor the cow goddess, and the host in the center is a symbol of Ra, the Sun god of Egypt. And of course, as you should know by now, this is an image of the unholy trinity; the two horns on either side, the masculine symbols; they are supposed to be perversions of God the Father, and God the Son. The feminine or circular image in the center is a perversion of the Holy Spirit. So we have the unholy trinity, Satan, the Antichrist and the False Prophet. Now it's interesting, if you turn this



upside down, you do get another interesting image. I don't know, what is that? Is that like a maybe a Muslim with a headscarf, or maybe is that an alien? Is that a skeleton? I don't know but it's certainly very eerie looking. In any case, the real image that is even worse, is this perverted symbol of the One World Religion. So I wanted to bring that to your attention today. It's very likely that your church has missalettes like this, and other than the ugly evil front cover, the rest of the missalette is very good, and that's all I have for you today.
