

## Amazing End Times Prophecy: 46 Popes in the Tilma of Guadalupe

In just the past few days, less than a week actually, an amazing End Times prophecy about the Popes of our Catholic Church has been discovered in the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Below you see the upper half of the Guadalupe image and what the eight pointed stars look like.



I call it miraculous, because this image was created by Almighty God Himself almost 500 years ago. Now I did not make this discovery about the Popes myself. An Italian Biblical scholar by the name of Alessandro Massano published it just last week and I'll put a link to his video below.

Normally, I would not do another video on the same topic, but I thought it was very important to get this information out to the English speaking public as soon as possible. The End Times are moving way too fast to waste time on formalities.

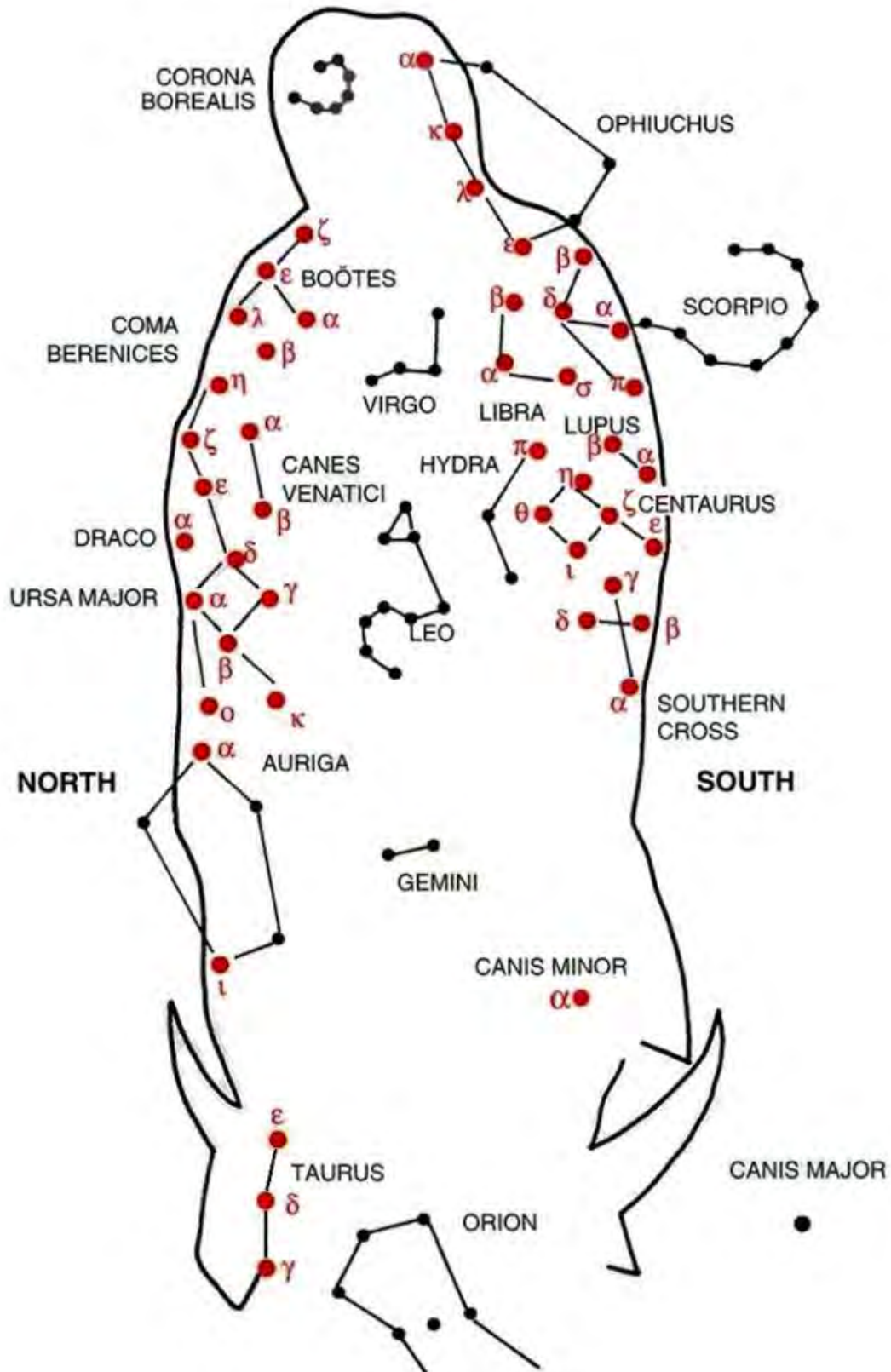
So first, let's examine the 46 stars on the Tilma as a whole, because they are directly related to the 46 Popes who have occupied the Chair of Peter in our Church since the Tilma was revealed to Saint Juan Diego in 1531.

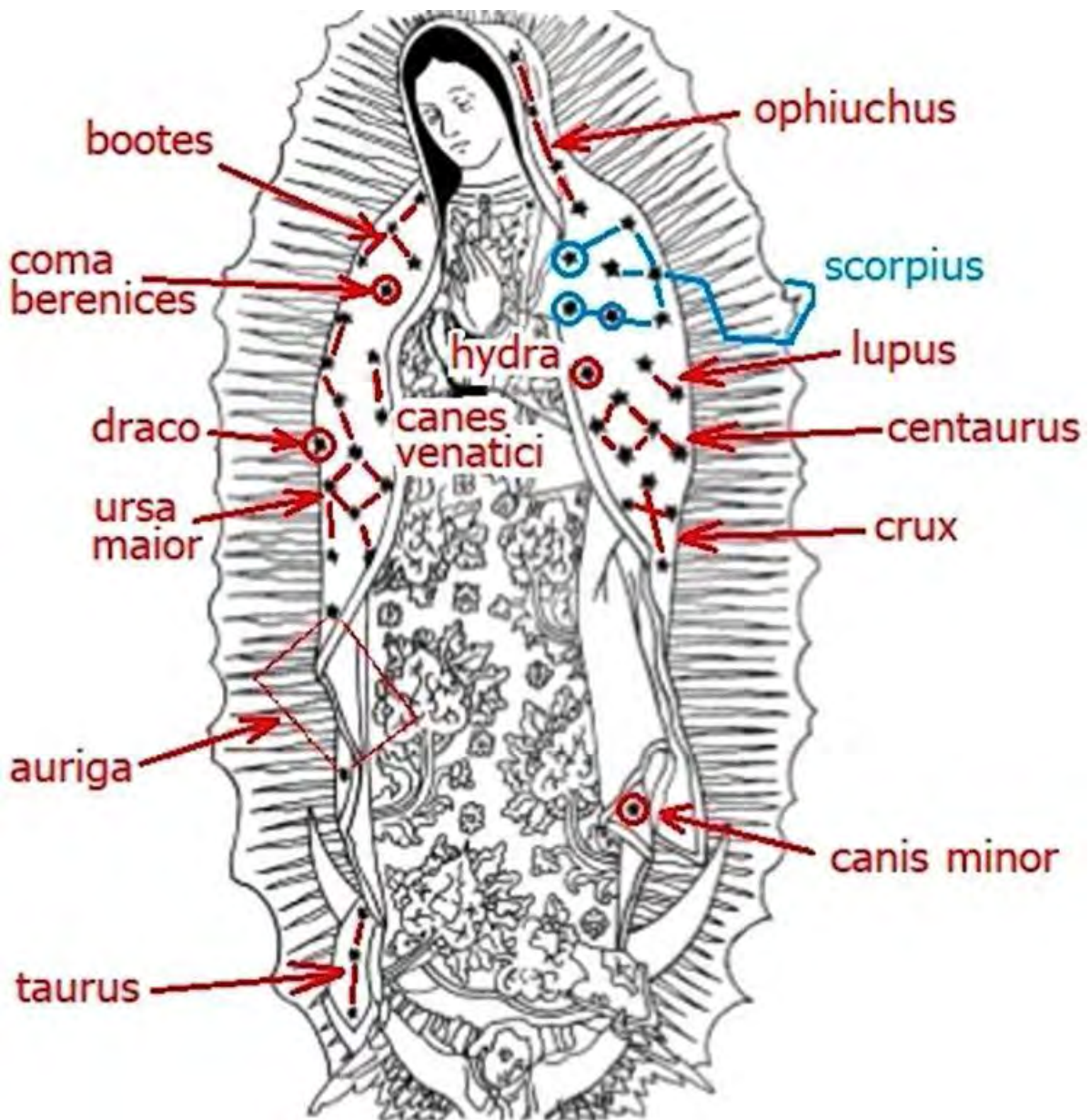


Please notice there are only 46 stars on the Tilma, but we have had 47 Popes. The star representing Pope Francis is nowhere to be found on the Tilma. I am convinced, through this miraculous sign, that Almighty God is telling us Pope Francis is not a legitimate Pope.

However, just because there are 46 stars on the Tilma and 46 Popes since the miracle, we cannot automatically conclude that Francis is excluded from the Tilma, unless we can establish a direct connection between the 46 stars and those 46 popes from the last 500 years.

So first, let's examine the locations of the 46 stars as found in their constellations. If you search Google images, you will find many diagrams of these constellations. I took these ones from Alessandro Massano's video.





Starting in a counter-clockwise direction on the bottom right is “Canis Minor” which consists of 1 star. The name Canis Minor means, “Lesser Dog”. Next we see above that the constellation “Southern Cross” or “Crux” which means “cross” and consists of 4 stars in the shape of a cross.

Above that is “Centaurus” which shows 5 stars. Next are 2 stars from the constellation “Lupus” or “Wolf” and to the left of that we see the single star of “Hydra”. Above those stars we find “Scorpio”. Like many of the constellation stars on the Tilma, we see only those stars that are located within the visual confines of the Tilma. There are many stars of these constellations that are located outside the Tilma. It has taken a lot of detective work over many years and a careful study of the sky over Mexico at the time of the miracle to identify them. The 4 stars from Scorpio that we see are connected with 3 stars to the left which are now called “Libra”. At the time of the miracle of the Tilma, however, those three stars were referred to as the

“claws” of the scorpion and thus we see a total of 7 stars in Scorpio. Above Scorpio is “Ophiuchus” which contains 4 stars.

Moving on now to the left side of the Tilma, at the top we find the 4 stars of “Bootes” which means the “Herdsman” in both Latin and Greek. Below that we see 1 star of “Coma Berenices” and below that, the 2 stars of “Canes Venatici”. To the left of that we see 1 star from the constellation “Draco” and between those two images we see the largest constellation on the Tilma, the 9 stars of “Ursa Major”. Continuing down the left side of the Tilma, as we are looking at it, we see 2 stars of the constellation “Auriga” and finally, at the bottom left we find 3 stars of “Taurus”, the bull. Notice I said, “As we are looking at it”. We are not seeing the constellations as the woman on the Tilma, that is Mary, is seeing them; we are viewing them in reverse, as they were imprinted on the Tilma. As a demonstration of this principle, if a laser beam burned a hole in the right side of my shirt and then I removed the shirt and looked at it, the burn hole would appear on the left, just the reverse in other words.

Next, we will show how these 46 stars are directly related to the 46 Popes that have ruled the Catholic Church since the time of this great miracle, thus proving that Francis is nowhere to be found on the Tilma. For example, we find 9 stars in the constellation “Ursa Major: and lo and behold, we have had 9 Popes who adopted the name “Pius”, as shown in the list on your screen: Pius IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI and XII. Is this just an amazing coincidence?

We find the next largest number of stars, that is 7, in the constellation Scorpio. Will we find 7 corresponding Popes who chose the same name? Well yes, as a matter of fact we will. On your screen is a list of the 7 popes who went by the name of “Clement” starting with Clement the VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, XIII and XIV.

Incidentally, the tradition of changing a Pope’s name was started by Jesus Himself when he changed Peter’s name from Simon to Peter.

The next largest number of stars are the 5 stars we saw in the constellation “Centaurus”. This may be beginning to sound old hat, but have I got your attention yet? Because, yes we find 5 popes since the miracle of the Tilma who took the

name of “Innocent”: Innocent the IX, X, XI, XII, and XIII. Are you beginning to see a pattern here?

However, we will not find Pope Francis’s name anywhere on the Tilma no matter how hard we look.

Next we recall there are three constellations that consist of 4 stars each, “Southern Cross” or “Cruce”, “Bootes” and “Ophiuchus”. By now, I’m sure you won’t be surprised, but you should be! Just like the stars, there are three groupings of four Popes each who took the same name, “Paul”, “Gregory”, and Benedict”. None of this is accidental, people. Almighty God is giving us a stunning prophecy, posted 500 years ago, about our End Times Catholic Church.

Next we find there are three stars in the constellation Taurus and, wait for it, we find three Popes with the name of “Leo”, Leo XI, Leo XII and Leo XIII.

Moving on to constellations that consist of two stars, as seen on the Tilma, we find three sets, “Auriga”, “Canes Venatici” and “Lupus”. Now, a good teacher would stop the class right and ask for a show of hands: how many of you think there might be 3 sets of two Popes each who took the same name. For those of you who said yes, you are correct.

Let’s look at Pope Alexander the VII and VIII, Pope Urban VII and VIII and Pope John Paul I and II. Incidentally, you will find an interesting chart with all the Popes listed on that video by Alessandro Massano. Massano stated in his video that the odds of these correlations happening is many billions to one.

So now, all that remain are the four constellations represented on the Tilma by one star each, “Hydra”, “Canis Minor”, “Draco”, and “Coma Berenices”.

And neither are there any more Popes with duplicate names. Surely we will find some of these final four who took the same name. No, I don't think so. Instead we find one Julius III, one Pope John the 23rd, one Pope Sixtus V and one Pope Marcellus II.

In conclusion, this miracle from Almighty God is stunning, one of the most stunning miracles of all time. 500 years ago, Almighty God predicted there would be 46 more true Popes until the end. He did this by imprinting 46 stars on the Tilma of Guadalupe and that there would be a direct connection between the number of names those 46 Popes chose for themselves and those stars in their constellations. And don't forget, Jesus said there would be signs in the sun, moon and stars to mark the End Times. Are the sun, moon and stars, as we find them on the Tilma of Guadalupe, one of the signs He was referring to?

And I sincerely hope Pope Francis is made aware of this amazing prophecy, and I hope he asks himself why is there no 47th star on the Tilma of Guadalupe. We have prayed Mary's Rosary many times for Pope Francis on our Third Eagle Books prophecy channel for him to resign from the Papacy and that he repents, but so far to no avail.

**The Tilma was revealed to Saint Juan Diego in 1531, (in Clement VII's reign).
