

## Taz Gives Bible Prophecy in Geico Commercial

Would you believe Geico has put out another amazing prophetic video and this time it's about the destruction of the United States and it features this cartoon character called Taz which is short for Tasmanian devil? Geico. Introducing the birds of America collection. 50 stunning hand painted plates commemorating the state birds of our... Geico, 15 minutes could save you 15% or more on car insurance.'***

Well, that was certainly different. We see the Tasmanian devil drink an energy drink and then destroy the 50 bird plates which represent the United States but did you catch the phallic symbol? Did you catch the name of the energy drink? Let's start at the beginning. In this first scene we see an interesting clock.



I'm not sure the significance of that time, it's a few minutes after 10. Maybe they are saying that is the hour the Whore of Babylon is going to be burned with fire and of course, the Whore of Babylon in Revelation refers primarily to the United States. Now if the 10 and the 12 were reversed, then this clock would be saying it is a few minutes before midnight.

Next, if we look at this Tasmanian devil, Taz, he has two horns. Could he therefore symbolize the False Prophet who also has two horns? And the man standing next to Taz has a little horn and of course the Antichrist is known as the 'little horn' in the Bible.
