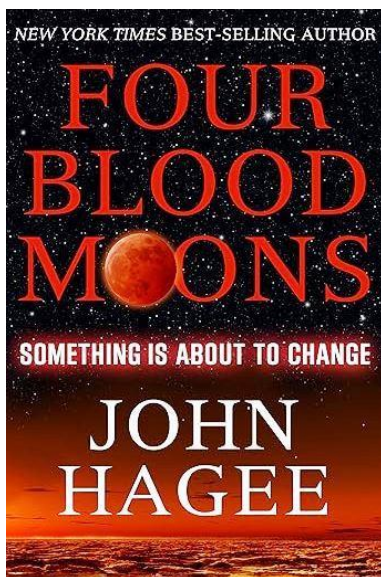


Trump's Peace Plan – Pt. 4 Trump's Peace Plan 4 Years plus 4 Months after Fourth Blood Moon!

On this program as you can tell by the title, Catholic Crusader last night came up with very interesting discovery and that is that Donald Trump and Benjamin Netanyahu's peace plan was announced on January 28th. That was this past Tuesday, January 28th 2020, and it turns out that is exactly four years plus four months from the fourth blood moon, and the fourth blood moon if you remember had made a big stir when they occurred. There were four blood moons and the last of the four blood moons occurred as I say it was on September 28th 2015 and the false prophets all over said that four blood moons always meant some big huge event for the nation of Israel, and to keep watch with it.



And John Hagee published a book called “Four Blood Moons”, and I'll show you what that looks like, and the reason I'm showing it is because we're going to talk about that on this program. And I've read the book through and he's a good writer, but he makes a huge number of errors, and that's the problem with the false prophets. They don't understand that in order to understand End Times prophecy that you've got to unseal the prophecy before you can interpret it. And John Hagee made a lot of money. This was a New York Times and USA Today bestseller and I think it was on the New York Times list for what, 30 or 40 weeks I don't know. He sold a ton of copies and Mark Biltz also promoted the Four Blood Moons. Paul Begley did a bunch of videos, so did Irvin Baxter, JD Farag, Chippewa and others.

They all talked about the four blood moons, and sure enough on the fourth blood moon there was a tremendous fulfilment of that prophecy. I did quite a few videos myself on them, but none of them acknowledged the fulfilment. And that was when the Jewish teenager Natan received a vision for End Times Israel, and he received it during a near-death experience. And those videos, there's quite a few of them now got a lot of views, and it did get a lot of publicity, but it's very strange to me that none of those false prophets acknowledged that that was the fulfilment. I mean I don't know why they wouldn't acknowledge it. To me it's amazing.

Well this last week we had another fulfilment, and that is that the peace plan for Israel was unveiled exactly as I say, four years, four months after the fourth blood moon. And as we should all know by now, 444 is an extremely important End Times number. It shows up quite a bit in End Times prophecy. It's not a good number. It's like 666 and it is specifically a warning number. So what I want to do is to go through John Hagee's book because his was by far the most popular of all those people that I mentioned, and I'm going to correct a lot of the errors in this book.

So I'm going to go through this starting at the beginning and I'm just going to make comments on what he has written, and as I say, he's a good writer. Unfortunately he's not accurate. So this is on page 23, and he's talking about Ezekiel 38 and they all get Ezekiel 38 wrong. They all say that the events in the Middle East are leading up to the Ezekiel 38 war. That is a huge error. Events in the Middle East are leading up to the Daniel 9 war, and here's what he writes.

“The fact that God hurled stones from the heavens to defend Israel in Joshua 10 is living proof that God will use stones as a weapon of war to crush the Iranian and Russian forces coming against Israel. This will happen as recorded by the prophet Ezekiel in chapter 38.”

So God is going to throw stones basically at Putin, and this is false. I do believe it is Russia and Iran who will come against Israel in these End Times in the Daniel 9 war, and we find this and in 2nd Kings, where the two she-bears come out of the woods and attack the 42 youths who make fun of the prophet. That is Israel today. The 42 youths symbolize Israel because of the 4,000 years of Israel's Old Testament and 2,000 years of the New Testament. That's the 4 and the 2 and Israel make fun of the prophets today. This is a description of what will happen and God is not going to throw stones at the enemies of Israel. That is a fantasy dreamed up by John Hagee. Okay next is on page 80, and here's what he writes.

“Get ready, the king is coming. Paul describes the rapture to the believers in Corinth and Thessalonica by declaring - for the last Trumpet will sound”, that's 1st Corinthians, “and the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout” that's 1st Thessalonians. “We will not sleep but we will all be changed. The dead in Christ will rise first in the twinkling of an eye the dead shall be raised then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with him in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air.”

So he thinks that this last part sounds like the Rapture, but this is not the Rapture. Paul is not describing the Rapture. First of all he talks about the shout, and the trumpet. There's no trumpet or shout in the Rapture. The Rapture is private. This is when Jesus comes for his bride and He takes them to the marriage supper of the Lamb. The best image of the Rapture is found in the parable of the five wise and the five foolish virgins. It does occur at midnight. There is a shout, but it is not a sound of trumpet, and the dead don't rise at the Rapture. It's for the bride of Christ. So this is a misinterpretation of Paul. What Jesus is describing here is His coming at Armageddon or I should say His forthcoming as a judge. That's when the dead will rise. In fact everyone will be judged, so that's what our Lord is describing here. So John Hagee's got that wrong. Let's look at page 90, and he talks about the last trump.

“The last Trump is recorded in 1st Corinthians when the church is raptured. Listen I tell you a mystery. We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye.”

Well basically I just went through that. That is not the Rapture that is when Jesus comes at judgment.

“Then all the people on the earth will mourn when they see the Son of man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. Then he will send His angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.”

This is Armageddon. This has nothing to do with a Rapture either. And this is an accurate translation when he talks about Jesus sends his angels with a loud trumpet call.

“and they will gather his elect”, those are the remnant Catholics, **“from under the four winds”** that's when the Catholics will have been scattered in the desert, **“from one end of heaven to the other”**, and one end of heaven, are the raptured Protestants, and in the other end of heaven are the holy martyrs. Those are the three armies that battle with Jesus at the Battle of Armageddon, and John Hagee does not understand that there is a distinction between those three groups.

And farther down on page 91, he talks about the Tribulation. He says, **“Those that are taken up in the Rapture will escape the wrath of the Antichrist.”** That's true. **“The Tribulation begins with the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse appearing in Revelation 6. The first rider is the Antichrist riding a white horse and coming to conquer the nations of the world.”**

That is incorrect. The White Horse represents apostasy. It's more likely that the rider of the White Horse is Martin Luther, but he would never say that, and I don't say that definitely, but I think probably the rider of the White Horse is a particular person, but it's not the Antichrist.

“He will make a seven-year peace treaty with Israel.”

This is the **biggest error** of all the false prophets. The Antichrist does not sign any kind of seven-year peace treaty with Israel, and we've been going over that entirely this week. It is the good guy, the Anointed One who confirms a covenant, and I'm been suggesting all week that this is Benjamin Netanyahu who confirms the covenant, and that is what we saw on Tuesday, the confirming of the covenant and the covenant that he confirms is the Abrahamic Covenant and that is, that the land of Canaan would be given to the Jews in perpetuity.

And after he says this, he's talking about the Antichrist, **“He will make a seven-year peace treaty with Israel”**, that's false, **“and break it after only three and a half years.”** That's all fantasy. **“He will cause every person on earth to receive the mark in his right hand or forehead and without it you cannot buy or sell. Those who reject the mark will have the heads cut off.”**

The Antichrist does not cause everyone to take the Mark of the Beast. That's a very common error also among the false prophets, and all you have to do is read the passage Revelation 13:16. He's got it right here, but if you read it carefully it's the False Prophet who causes everyone to take the Mark of the Beast. The beast from the earth in other words, not the beast from the sea.

And on page 120 he makes an interesting comment here about the United States. He says, **“If America is to survive, there must be a time of national repentance for our sins and a return to the eternal truths of the Word of God.”**

I couldn't agree more with that John Hagee, but what you don't understand is that Israel must also repent, and you know in this entire book, you never say once that Israel has to repent, and that's a big mistake on your part. If you're going to take the role of a prophet, you can't feed Israel pillows and cushions. You're not doing them a favour. Many people in Israel are going to die because of false prophets like you. In other words the Bible says, “My people perish for lack of knowledge”, and that's what's going to happen. On page 149, he talks about the abomination of Antiochus Epiphanes.

“What is the abomination of desolation? The abomination of desolation is the desecration of the temple in Jerusalem and the termination of blood sacrifice for the atonement of sin.”

Well this is true, but it does not occur in the End Times. This is the abomination of desolation brought about by Antiochus Epiphanes. We looked at the chart earlier this week. I think it occurred in 176 BC. This is the warning for the Protestants. In other words, they have to be ready for the Rapture at any time. Let's look at page 153, a good Rosary number.

He writes, **“The Antichrist will come from the Roman Empire since he is a ruler of the people which destroyed Jerusalem.”** And I have no idea what he's talking about. The person who destroyed Jerusalem was the Roman General Titus not the Antichrist, and if he's talking about the End Times, the one who destroys Jerusalem in Daniel 9:26 is “the prince who will come”. It doesn't say it's the Antichrist. He's interpreting that wrongly. Well because he doesn't unseal first, and let's look and see what he says on page 154.

“The coming Antichrist will be the ultimate abomination of desolation,” well he will be. He's one of the abominations of desolation, **“because he will introduce himself as God, and demand that the world worship him. He will set up his image in Jerusalem, and present himself as saviour of the world.”**

He does eventually go to Jerusalem, but he first sets himself up in the temple in the Vatican, in other words the temple which he sets himself up in is the Roman Catholic Church. And his way is being prepared now by the False Prophet Pope Francis. And Mary prophesied this at La Salette that Rome will lose the faith and become the seat of the Antichrist, and we see that occurring right now.

Let's look at page 155, and he writes to the Jewish people. This is Jesus' warning to the Jewish people about the time and identity of the Antichrist. He's quoting from Matthew 24, and we're very familiar with this and I've talked about it a million times.

“Then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains”, and he thinks this is all referring to the Jews, and it's not. **“Let him who is on the housetop not go**

down to take anything out of his house”, and those who were in Judea, those were the remnant Jews. Those who are on the housetop, those are the raptured Protestants. **“And let him who is in the field not go back to get his clothes”**, that would be the protected Catholics. The “field” is the Roman Catholic Church, **“But woe to those who are pregnant”**; now these are the martyrs, the fourth group who reign with Jesus during the Millennium. **“But woe to those who are pregnant and to those who are nursing babies in those days! And pray that your flight may not be in winter or on the Sabbath.”** And those are all physical hindrances. It's difficult for pregnant women, nursing women. It's going to be difficult in the winter. I'm not sure why it's difficult on the Sabbath, but those are all physical hindrances, which tell me that all of these flights that he just talked about in Judea from the field and so on, those are actual, physical flights.

So let's look at page 157, and he writes about the Antichrist again, page 156, starting there, **“Revelation 6 describes the red horse of war, the black horse of famine and the pale horse of death. This trinity of torment thunders across the face of the earth commanded by the Antichrist who is riding the white horse in revelation 6:2.”**

And I as I said, the white horse represents apostasy. It's the first of the four horses. No doubt about that and that comes first. I mean that comes before the war, famine and death.

Let's look at page 160. **“The next major prophetic war that is coming to the Middle East will be the Gog / Magog War”**. No, this is not true, and he's talking about Ezekiel. The next war is the Daniel 9 war. **“Among those nations coming against Israel is Germany,”** John Hagee, come on. Germany is going to come against Israel? **“who will follow Russia and Iran.”** Russia and Iran I agree with.

“They will be joined by Ethiopia,” Ethiopia coming against Israel? **“Libya, Turkey”**, maybe Turkey, but he mentions all the countries found in Ezekiel 38, but since this is not the Ezekiel 38 war, none of those are involved. The countries that are involved are the nations round about Israel. Isn't it strange that he does not mention here the countries that are adjacent to Israel, and that would be Iraq; did he mention Iraq? Oh yes he mentioned Iraq; but Jordan, Egypt and Syria, he doesn't mention any of those countries. The war coming up in the Middle East will involve those four nations as Daniel says, the nations around Israel, not Germany, and all those other countries, Ethiopia? I don't think so.

So maybe I'll leave the rest of this book until tomorrow, and so I think I'll stop right there and we'll continue critiquing this book by John Hagee about the Four Blood Moons then. And the reason the four blood moons, the reference to them occurred this week is because, as Catholic Crusader discovered yesterday, the peace treaty announced by Donald Trump and Benjamin Netanyahu came exactly four years and four months after the fourth blood moon; very interesting.
