

Petrus Romanus: The Final Pope Pt 3

This is part 3 in my series on Petrus Romanus who, according to the amazing prophecies which Saint Malachy received, is the final Pope of the Catholic Church. In the first two parts of this series, I debunked some of the popular misconceptions being spread around YouTube that Petrus Romanus will be an evil Pope. This is completely false. According to Saint Malachy, Pope Petrus Romanus will *'feed his sheep'* during the Great Tribulation. And I also pointed out that Petrus Romanus will probably feed his sheep from heaven because he is in fact, Pope Peter I, Saint Peter.

On this program I want to talk about how Petrus Romanus is prefigured in the Old Testament by Mordecai in the book of Esther. As you, my regular subscribers already know, the book of Esther is an extremely important prophecy of these End Times and the reason is because we learn the very important 'chain of command' which we will need to know to defeat the Antichrist.

The Jews in the book of Esther prefigure End Times Christians. They appeal to Mordecai, who prefigures the End Times Petrus Romanus, the last Pope. He in turn appeals to Queen Esther who prefigures the Blessed Virgin Mary. She appeals to King Ahasuerus who symbolizes Jesus Christ and King Ahasuerus in turn hangs Haman and his ten sons on a fifty cubit tall scaffold. Fifty cubits equals 75 feet, the height of a five story building, in fact, some Bibles translate it as seventy-five feet; however, that is a huge mistake because the important symbolism is in the number 50.

Next, what I am going to tell you will not make me popular, but then again, what true prophet ever is popular? The weapons Jesus uses against Haman and his ten sons are Mary's Rosary and Scapular. The hangman's noose symbolizes Mary's Scapular, the 50 cubit tall scaffold prefigures Mary's Rosary because there are 50 Hail Marys in a five decade Rosary. Hamas is the Antichrist in the End Times, his ten sons are the Ten Kings. You may not accept this now but once the Antichrist begins his reign on the earth, you will remember what I am telling you.

And now, let's look at where Mordecai is found in the book of Esther because we always find him seated out in front of the palace gates and this is very typical of Saint Peter also. Esther, chapter 6, verse 12: ***'And Mordecai returned to the king's gate. But Haman hastened to***

his house mourning, and having his head covered.' Mordecai, stationing himself before the king's gate, that is before the gates of heaven, indicates Saint Peter. There is a very popular depiction of Saint Peter at the Pearly Gates. You see it in cartoons, for example; but there is some basis for this convention because Jesus gave Peter the keys to the kingdom and, of course, the man with the keys to the gate would undoubtedly be standing by the gate.

Let's see another passage from the book of Esther, chapter 4, verse 6: **'And Hathach, (Hathach was a courier between Queen Esther and Mordecai) going out went to Mordecai, who was standing in the street of the city, before the palace gate.'** This is where you can always find Mordecai. In addition to standing before the gates of the King, Ahasuerus, who symbolizes Jesus, and therefore his palace would symbolize heaven, there are several incidents in Mordecai's account as found in the book of Esther which remind me very much of things which happened to Saint Peter and I believe these are indications of what may very well happen during the reign of the Antichrist also; I believe these are prophecies.

For example, Mordecai exposes a plot against King Ahasuerus by two of the king's eunuchs and the eunuchs of Esther prefigure the celibate Catholic clergy of the End Times. Does this predict some kind of action by Petrus Romanus against betrayal of the Catholic clergy during the reign of the Antichrist? Esther 2, verse 21, **'In those days, while Mordecai sat in the king's gate (notice once again we find Mordecai before the gates of the palace) two of the king's eunuchs, Bigthan and Teresh, of those who kept the door, were angry, and sought to lay hands on king Ahasuerus.'**

This reminds me somewhat of an incident in Saint Peter's ministry where he exposed the fraud of two early Christians, Ananias and Sapphira. They tried to defraud Peter of a certain amount of money and when Peter exposed them, they died on the spot and this is very similar to Mordecai exposing the two eunuchs and they also died, they were executed by the King.

Acts 5, verses 3-5: **'But Peter said, Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit, and to keep back part of the price of the land? While it remained, was it not your own? and after it was sold, was it not in your own power? Why have you conceived this thing in your heart? you have not lied unto men, but unto God. And Ananias hearing these words fell down, and**

died: and great fear came on all them that heard these things.' So are these two incidents, one which happened to Peter, another which happened to Mordecai and which are similar, do they prophesy an event during the reign of Petrus Romanus? Will he also expose some kind of fraud within the Catholic Church, probably perpetrated by our next false Pope, and that is the False Prophet.

Another fascinating incident which occurs to Mordecai is when the king tells Haman to honor Mordecai, in fact, he tells Haman who, don't forget is a prefigure of the Antichrist, to lead Mordecai through the city on a horse and have Mordecai dressed in king's robes with a crown on his head. Is this also a prophecy of the End Times? Esther 6, verse 10: **'Then the king said to Haman, make haste, and take the robes and the horse, as you have said, and do even so to Mordecai the Jew, who sits at the king's gate.'** Isn't it interesting that even the king knows you can always find Mordecai: out by the gates of the palace.

A somewhat similar occurrence happens when Saint Peter is approached by Simon Magus, who is also a precursor of the Antichrist, and the magician Simon, tries to buy some of Peter's supernatural powers and here's what Saint Peter says: Acts 8, verses 18-21: **'And when Simon saw that through laying on of the apostles' hands the Holy Spirit was given, he offered them money, saying, 'Give me this power also, so that anyone on whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit.'** But Peter said unto him, **Your money perish with you, because you have thought that the gift of God may be purchased with money. You have neither part nor lot in this matter: for your heart is not right in the sight of God.'**

So in both these incidents, the precursor of the Antichrist must acknowledge the final Pope, Petrus Romanus. In other words, Haman must acknowledge the greatness of Mordecai and Simon Magus acknowledges the greatness of Saint Peter. Thus, is this a prophecy of the End Times? Will this occur during the reign of the Antichrist? And of course, this is sort of speculation because we really won't know until it happens, but is this one way that God is giving us a clue of how we can tell who Petrus Romanus will be? So, if any of you have any other suggestions, please let me know because I believe I have just begun to scratch the surface as to the tremendous significance of Mordecai in the book of Esther and how he prefigures Petrus Romanus, our final Pope.
