

Mary's School of Prophecy Jeremiah 23 – Pt 3

This is part 3 in my series on the amazing End Times prophecies as found in Jeremiah's chapter number 23, and you can search the internet or anywhere else all you like and no one else has ever understood that this particular chapter is apocalyptic literature. It is a prophecy of these End Times. It is a warning to the false Catholic, Protestant and Jewish pastors; all three denominations are specified by Jeremiah. Now he doesn't use those words. He uses code words, but that's my job as a co-prophet to explain exactly who Jeremiah is warning. In fact the very first sentence of Jeremiah 23 tells what this chapter is about, and that is, "Woe to the pastors", and then sometimes I think that Jeremiah is telling us that all the problems we have in these End Times are due to the false Catholic, Protestant and Jewish pastors. That's very possible that it is on their shoulders because at the end of this chapter, Jeremiah 23, he tells what is going to happen these false pastors. They are going to be cast into Hell.

And so now let's continue with our study of Jeremiah, and let's start by reviewing Jeremiah's Cryptogram. I know this will get old hand, but any professor will tell you that you never say things just once. You have to say to him at least a half dozen times. This is Jeremiah's cryptogram.

JEREMIAH'S CRYPTOGRAM

This is how he's sealed up the prophecy, and all of the verses are there just as they are in your bibles, except that you read them in a different order. The verses on the left-hand vertical column, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and the second column, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 etc., all

of the verses are there, except when you read them; this is how Jeremiah sealed the prophecy; you must read them in a horizontal line. In other words the first verse starts the prophecy as usual, but then you follow with the sixth verse, because that is the actual second verse. That is how Jeremiah wrote out the prophecy. He sealed it up by scrambling the verses according to this pattern. And we've already talked about line 1, the top line, which we discovered was primarily a warning to the Protestant false prophets of the End Times.

Now line 2, we just began yesterday, and that is a warning to the Jewish false prophets of these End Times, and they are leading Israel astray, so let's take a look at the second line of Jeremiah's Cryptogram.

2. Therefore thus saith the Lord the God of Israel to the pastors that feed my people: You have scattered my flock, and driven them away, and have not visited them: behold I will visit upon you for the evil of your doings, saith the Lord.
7. Therefore behold the days to come, saith the Lord, and they shall say no more: The Lord liveth, who brought up the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt:
12. Therefore their way shall be as a slippery way in the dark: for they shall be driven on, and fall therein: for I will bring evils upon them, the year of their visitation, saith the Lord.
17. They say to them that blaspheme me: The Lord hath said: You shall have peace: and to every one that walketh in the perverseness of his own heart, they have said: No evil shall come upon you.

We talked about the first verse yesterday on the second line, which is verse number 2: **“Therefore thus saith the Lord the God of Israel.”** Now God changes his name from the first verse. In the first verse it's the Lord of righteousness; here He is the God of Israel. That's the first clue we have that this second line is a warning to the false Jewish prophets; **“to the pastors that feed my people”**, and “my people” would be God's people. That would be the chosen people. So he's telling us he's verifying them, and the second part of this sentence is that he is talking to the Jewish pastors that feed the Jews, and this is in Israel. **“You have scattered my flock”**; again “my flock” refers to God's flock or the chosen people, **“and driven them away, and have not visited them: behold I will visit upon you for the evil of your doings, saith the Lord.”** So this is one of the woes that are mentioned in the first sentence, “woe to the pastors”, and this is a woe that God is going to visit upon the false Jewish pastors of these End Times.

Verse number 7: **“Therefore behold the days to come, saith the Lord, and they shall say no more: the Lord liveth, who brought up the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt.”** And I would like to add here that if you get a chance, you should

watch the near-death experience that Natan had, the Jewish teenage visionary. He had a near-death experience and he had a very important vision. It was a fulfillment of the fourth blood moon. Now people like Mark Blitz and John Hagee, they were all over the internet and they wrote a million best sellers talking about the four blood moons and how they were always significant for Israel. And then when it happened on the night of the fourth blood moon, Natan received his amazing End Times prophecy and none of them referred to it. As soon as the fourth blood moon passed, they completely stopped talking about it, whereas a very important prophecy occurred, and that was Natan's prophecy.

So let's go back to the second line, and verse number 12. **"Therefore their way",** this is the false prophets of Israel, **"shall be as a slippery way in the dark: for they shall be driven on, and fall therein: for I will bring evils upon them, the year of their visitation, saith the Lord."** Now this is an extremely important verse. What is the year of their visitation? God is referring back to the first verse on this second line. Let's take a look at that; **"behold I will visit upon you for the evil of your doings"**. In verse 12, God tells us **when** He is going to visit His evils upon them, and that is the year of their visitation. This is really specific. There is a specific year that Israel is going to face this destruction, and of course I have said all along that what they are facing in the Middle East; the events are leading up to the Daniel 9 war, not the Ezekiel 38 war.

The false prophets like J.D. Farag are all over YouTube telling you that events in the Middle East are leading up to the Ezekiel 38 war. That is false, and as I say, there are many false prophets and that's exactly what Jeremiah is telling you. There are many false prophets, and one of them is that they feed pillows and cushions to the people of Israel saying that you are invincible. There's no need to worry. God is going to protect you. I remember John Hagee saying the same thing. God is going to throw stones at the invading armies and he completely skips over the Daniel 9 war, and that's what Jeremiah is warning them about.

And verse number 17: **"They say to them that blaspheme me:"**, now "they" would be the false Jewish prophets; "them" would be the Jews in Israel that blaspheme God. **"The Lord hath said: You shall have peace:"**; this is what the false prophets say, "the Lord has said you shall have peace", **"and to every one that walks in the perverseness of his own heart."** Now perverseness in the Bible is always homosexuality or in other words as John said, Jerusalem would be a Sodom and an Egypt; and **"they have said: No evil shall come upon you."**

So Jeremiah is talking here about two ways in which the false Hebrew prophets, the false rabbis in Israel are giving the people of Israel pillows and cushions. Number 1, they shall have peace, and they're not going to have peace, and number 2, that they can promote homosexuality and make Jerusalem the capital of the world without consequence, and of course this is exactly what Jeremiah is specifying what the

false prophets in Israel are feeding the people; the lies that they are feeding them, and those are the two lies.

So let's go back now. I think we covered all of Jeremiah 17, yes. Let me just read that again. This is what the false Jewish prophets are saying. **“The Lord has said: You shall have peace:”**, when of course the Lord has not said that, **“and to every one that walks in the perverseness of his own heart, they have said: No evil shall come upon you.”**

So remember those two lies which the false Hebrew prophets are teaching the people of Israel, and you in my audience, you have got to learn this because when we come to the refuges, people are going to look to you for the answers. Why did this happen, because after Israel is afflicted with the Daniel 9 war, we will undoubtedly at that time begin our refuges, and people will want to know what happened to Israel, and you will know. You will be able to point them to Jeremiah chapter 23 which is a warning as I say to all three denominations.

So let's continue on. This is verse 22 on the second line. **“If they stood in my counsel, and had made my words known to my people, I should have turned them from their evil way and from their wicked doings.”** Notice there are two things here; “evil way”, “wicked doings”. The “wicked doings” refer to the homosexuality, and the “evil way” turns to their relying on things like the Iron Dome and missiles to protect them, and the IDF. “They shall have peace”, the false prophets in Israel are telling them, and they're not going to have peace, and well maybe we'll stop right there, and we'll continue line 2 tomorrow.
