

Mary's School of Prophecy

Optional Celibacy and the Fall of the Roman Catholic Church

I ran across a very interesting article on Life Site News that I thought I would read this for you, and I also thought I would read to you something from the Bayside prophecies 40 years ago where our Lord warned against a married priesthood. So let me read that.

This is from Bayside, and I have all the Bayside prophecies. I used to go to Bayside quite often. I never really saw anything miraculous there. I shouldn't say never. Once in a great while I would see something, but not nearly as much as other people. I know I had a camera once and I was hoping to get miraculous pictures and I would take all the pictures of everything that I thought ought to be miraculous and nothing came out miraculous. And at the end when the vigil was over with, and I was kind of bemoaning my fate to people around me; I said, "I don't know how come I never get miraculous pictures. Everybody else does." And there was a young lady there and she says, "Oh it's easy to get miraculous pictures." She took my camera and she aimed it at the ground. Took a picture and all these spectacular things came out in the picture, so I realized that it wasn't the camera it was it was "Yours Truly" that was not in tune with the spiritual world.

Anyway so I don't guarantee Bayside is accurate or not, although I read all the messages and I never found anything in them that was contrary to faith or morals. Now I should add though that the local bishop condemned Bayside many, many years ago, but of course the local bishop also condemned Joan of Arc to burning at the stake as a witch, so you can't always go by what the local bishop says. Despite rumours to the contrary, the Catholic Church has never made any final determination on Bayside. So I'm going to read this to you having read that disclaimer. As you know Pope Francis tomorrow will allow married priests. Of course it'll be just be, oh very rare circumstances, and of course we all know what that means.

Let me read what this says. This is: "Deacons you do not need this procedure." This is from, if you have your own book, this is May 23rd 1979, 40 years ago, and Jim O'Connor alerted me to this, and I'll read this. This is not very long.

"I am much concerned over your search for change in My church. In the book of life the Bible, the full knowledge is given to you of the construction of My church. Why are you now planning to take married men, making them what you call deacons, to give the sanctity and holiness, the grace in marriage to My sheep? What right have you to change the rules and the direction? Understand well: when I appointed the Apostles there were no names given as cardinals or bishops: but Peter was the first Pope, the leader, and would you say not that the Apostles were the first bishops? And after that they chose from out of the multitudes, seven whom you called deacons and listed as deacons, but they were truly priests at that time. But you do not need the procedure now. If you are willing to ask the Eternal Father, and if you do not give yourselves over to doctrines of demons, you will have priests sufficient to carry out the ministry. But what do you do

now? You will seek to make instant priests, against the will of the Eternal Father! You will delude others to think that your deacons can take the Sacraments and give them as in the priesthood!”

This is exactly what Pope Francis is going to propose tomorrow.

“A priest, My children, is a chosen man of God. A true legally ordained priest is far superior to any man, as he represents Me in the Godhead.”

And of course as we know, when a priest consecrates the Body and Blood of our Lord in the Eucharist, he is acting “in persona Christi”, and of course Jesus was celibate, and He said there are those who make themselves eunuchs for the sake of the kingdom, and as we all know no Protestant clergyman is willing to make himself a eunuch for the sake of the kingdom. This has been the glory of the priesthood in the Roman Catholic Church.

Other Christian denominations as I said including the Orthodox, allow priests to marry. Up until now we've always had enough priests, enough young men who are willing to make themselves eunuchs for the sake of the kingdom of heaven, so that we did not have a shortage of priests, but because the demonic has entered into the Church, as Pope Paul VI said, we do have a shortage of priests, but this is of course not the solution. Appealing to God the Father is the solution.

Before we continue, let's say the prayer to Our Lady of All Nations. In the name of the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit; Amen. Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Father, send now Your Spirit over the earth. Let the Holy Spirit live in the hearts of all nations, that they may be preserved from degeneration, disaster and war. May the Lady of All Nations, the Blessed Virgin Mary, be our Advocate; Amen. And Our Lady of All Nations has become the patroness of this particular program which is called Mary's School of Prophecy.

Now I'm going to read this article because it's about the priesthood and taking away the celibacy requirement. The date line on this is February the 10th on Life Site News.

“Cardinal Robert Sarah has declared that the Catholic priesthood is ‘in mortal danger’ and ‘going through a major crisis’ because of the push from various voices within the Church to abolish priestly celibacy.”

Well of course that's what Pope Francis wants. He doesn't admit that. He says that, oh no it'll be the bishops who wanted it. He's just doing what the bishops want. Of course he hand-picked the bishops for the Amazon Synod.

“The African prelate called out those who want to make celibacy optional. ‘By attacking the celibacy of priests, you are attacking the Church and her mystery’, he said.

Ahead of the publication of the post-synodal Apostolic Exhortation, ‘Querida Amazonia’ on Wednesday, February the 12th”, that's tomorrow; this will be big headlines, “which has been rumored to open the doors to married priests”;

well it's no rumor; I've been telling you ever since the Amazon Synod started, months and months ago, but it's a rumor for most of these people, ***“Cardinal Sarah told Edwin Penton of the National Catholic Register that faithful Catholics are not asking for priestly celibacy to be overturned.”***

This is true. I don't think any of the changes that came about because of Vatican 2 were due to pressure from the lay people, the faithful Catholics as he says. I know there was no pressure in my parish. None of the changes that were put in were because there was any kind of consensus. What do they call it, Consensus of the faithful? Isn't that one of the things that brings about change in the churches? “Sensus Fidei”, the sense of the faithful. There was no sense of the faithful to have a time to make celibacy optional. Let's see what else he says here.

“The ordination of married men is a fantasy of Western academics who are in search of violations. I want to affirm it forcefully: The poor, the simple, rank-and-file Christians do not demand an end to celibacy”, he said.

Sarah, the prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, said there are voices within the Church who would like to ‘relativize the celibacy of priests.’

‘That would be a catastrophe! For celibacy is the most obvious manifestation that the priest belongs to Christ and that he no longer belongs to himself. Celibacy is the sign of a life that has meaning only through God and for him,’ he said.

‘To want to ordain married men is to imply that priestly life is not full time, that it does not require a complete gift, that it leaves one free for other commitments such as a profession, that that it leaves time for free for a private life. But this is false. A priest remains a priest at all times. Priestly ordination is not first of all a generous commitment; it is a consecration of our whole being, an indelible confirmation of our soul to Christ, the priest, who demands from us permanent conversion in order to correspond to him. Celibacy is the unquestionable sign that being a priest supposes allowing oneself to be entirely possessed by God. To call it into question would seriously aggravate the crisis of the priesthood,’ he added.”

And that's exactly what will happen tomorrow. This is a division. The church is splitting up. There is a schism here. This is the fall of the Roman Catholic Church, and this is prophesied in Daniel 2 where the stone is cut out from the mountain. The mountain represents the Roman Catholic Church. The stone represents the Remnant Catholic Church, which will be cut out from the mountain without hands, and it is our destiny in this stone, to smash the feet of iron and clay. The feet of iron and clay symbolize the One World Government, and the One World Religion. Pope Francis does not want us to defeat the One World Religion or the One World Government. He's a globalist and Mary as we found out from that prayer we read is not a globalist. She's the Lady of All Nations, plural.

“With a contribution by Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, Cardinal Sarah has recently published a book defending priestly celibacy.

Sarah pointed to Germany, where married priests have been discussed for a long time, and more forcefully since the launch of the 'synodal path'.

But I am uneasy. In Germany, a strange synod clearly envisages the questioning of celibacy. I wanted to cry out my concern: Do not tear the Church apart!"

That's exactly what's happening.

"By attacking the celibacy of priests, you are attacking the Church and her mystery,' he said.

Explaining that those who attack celibacy want to make the Church a purely human institution," just like Protestant churches. He didn't say that, I did; "within our power, within our reach', the cardinal continued, 'It means renouncing the mystery of the Church as God's gift.'

If married men in the Amazon region were allowed to become priests, Sarah argued, that would 'prohibit the raising of vocations of unmarried priests. The exception would become a permanent state.'

Asked about priests within the Catholic Church who are married, namely as part of the Anglican Ordinariate and the Eastern churches, Sarah clarified that those exceptions constitute 'a parenthesis in the normal and natural state of things.' At the same time, he said, 'the lack of a priest is not an exception,' especially in nascent or dying churches.

Cardinal Sarah also attempted to dispel a number of myths surrounding the question of married priests. Even though married priests did indeed exist in the first few centuries of the Church, after their ordination, 'they were required to abstain completely from sexual relations with their wives.'"

I wasn't aware of that.

"Referring to the Council of Elvira in 305, Sarah made clear that one of the first concerns of the Church after the age of martyrdom was 'to affirm that priests must abstain from sexual relations with their wives.'

He quoted the council itself, which stated, 'It was unanimously agreed that bishops, priests and deacons, that is to say, all clerics constituted in the ministry, should abstain from their wives and should not bear children; whoever has done so (had sexual relations) should be declared to be deprived of the clerical office.'

In January, Cardinal Gerhard Mueller said that the Eastern churches, by allowing married priests had departed 'from the tradition of the early Church.'

Cardinal Sarah echoed this assessment. ‘It was only much later, because of the corruption of the texts, that the East would evolve in its discipline, without ever renouncing the ontological link between priesthood and abstinence.’”

I think I’ll read a little bit more in this article.

“Apart from historical considerations, Sarah also sees practical problems with having married priests, without doubting the holiness of married priests and Eastern Churches. ‘If a priest is married, then he has a private life, a conjugal and family life. He must make time for his wife and children. He is unable to show, by his whole life, that he’s totally and absolutely given to God and the Church.’”

And as I said, Jesus said that there are those who make themselves eunuchs for the sake of the kingdom of heaven and Jesus added that, let him who can do it, do it. (*Matthew 19:12*) He didn’t say, you might be able to do it, but if you can do it, you should do it. That’s the words of our Lord. As I say, no Protestant denomination minister is willing to make himself a eunuch for the sake of the kingdom.

“Starting with statements by former Pope Benedict XVI, Cardinal Sarah stated that he has shown, ‘that at the root of the abuses committed by clerics, there is a deep flaw in their formation.’”

‘They wanted to make the priest a man like any other. Some priests were formed without putting God, prayer, the celebration of Mass, the ardent search for holiness at the center of their lives,’ Sarah elaborated.

According to the African cardinal, priests were formed without teaching them about God as their only support, ‘without making them experience that their lives only have meaning through God and for him. ‘If God is taken out of the equation, the priest is left with nothing but power’, Sarah continued.

‘If a priest doesn’t daily experience (that) he is only an instrument in God’s hands, if he doesn’t stand constantly before God to serve him with all his heart, then he risks becoming intoxicated with a sense of power. If a priest’s life is not a consecrated life, then he is in great danger of illusion and diversion’, Sarah cautioned.

Cardinal Sarah briefly commented on the rollout of the book, *From the Depths of Our Hearts*, to which Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI had contributed.”

In fact Pope Benedict is listed as a co-author of this book, and I think I will stop there. You can read this article on Life Site News in its entirety, and it’s interesting it mentions here there was a controversy about the book, and as soon as the Vatican heard about it, they went bonkers. And they told Georg Gänswein, who was Pope Benedict’s secretary, that he had to tell Pope Benedict; I don’t think they even went to Pope Benedict, and he went right to the publisher, and told them they had to take Pope Benedict’s name off the book. And Ignatius Press said, no they’re

not going to, because they already had all the books all printed. So if you buy a book now from Ignatius Press, it will have a picture of Pope Benedict on the cover. And why would the Vatican go all bonkers? Because they know full well Pope Francis is going to make celibacy optional in the Roman Catholic Church, not in the Remnant Catholic Church. The Remnant Catholic Church will be isolated very soon. In fact the Italian Cardinal last weekend said if you don't support Pope Francis you should leave, and that's exactly what's going to happen.

I also think that this is going to backfire on the Vatican, because I think that what they want is, they want a lot of deacons who support Pope Francis, especially giving Communion to the divorced and civilly remarried, because that will invalidate the Eucharist. And if a priest doesn't go along with that, they want to replace him with a deacon that does go along with it, and right now they don't have enough deacons to do that. And I think this is going to boomerang on them because just as a lot of bishops are going to ordain married men in order to bolster their position, I predict that traditional bishops will start ordaining married men who oppose Pope Francis.

In fact I have suggested and I have some kind of inclination of this from a prophecy, that President Donald Trump will be ordained a priest. I know I got a lot of laughs from that at my Wednesday morning meeting with my priest and all the other people that go to Mass on Wednesday morning. We usually go down to the diner, and they thought that was kind of funny, but I'm sticking to my guns.
